

### Welcome to Early Years-Early Education and Childcare Service

• We support the early years sector to make sure they deliver a high quality, flexible, accessible and affordable childcare for children aged 0-4 years old.



#### What we do:

- Provide information, advice and assistance to parents and carers on the provision of early education and childcare in Tower Hamlets in partnership with the Families Information service (FIS)
- Secure early years provision free of charge for all three- and fouryear-olds through the universal and extended entitlement
- Support families accessing free childcare through the 2-year-old offer
- Provide information, support, advice, challenge and training to early education and childcare providers
- The Children and Families Act place a duty for local authorities to ensure all children who wish to take up the funded entitlements have the opportunity to do so.



### **Funded childcare**



- Each Funding Entitlement is for <u>up to</u> 15 hours a week or stretched over the year
- Each child is allocated 570 hours starting from the term after they turn 2 or 3 depending on the offer taken up.
- 2-year-old funding, for children whose parents and carers meet the criteria
- Universal 15 hours for all three and four-year-olds
- Extended 15 hours (making 30 hours) (1,140 in total) hours for working parents

#### Three points of access

- Directly through a childcare provider, who will support in completing application, checking eligibility and then offering a place having completed the checking and placement process.

- Children and Family Centres where the family can get help in completing the form via phone 020 7364 1553 or face to face at the Centre.





## Additional hours (30hours)

- To apply for the additional hours parents and carers need to enter their details via the online application process
- If eligible they receive a code that can be presented to the childcare provider
- Parents must reconfirm this code each term.


### Inclusion support within childcare

- Childcare providers include the day nurseries, playgroups and independent school
- Each of these childcare settings has an Inclusion Coordinator who is responsible for:
  - working with parents to identify and plan for children's need
  - supporting staff to identify and plan for children's needs
- linking with services to access support for children including the Early Years Inclusion Team

### **Early Years Inclusion Team**



- Four Area Inclusion Coordinators
- Focus on supporting settings in their partnership work with parents to:
- identify children's needs
- plan interventions for children
- review progress
- plan transition to school
- Support for childminders
