Do you use Adult Hearing Services? Give NHS Tees Valley CCG your thoughts

NHS Tees Valley CCG is currently reviewing non-complex, age-related adult hearing services across the Tees Valley. These services are provided for people usually aged 55+who have a non-complex hearing need that can be me

These services are commissioned using an 'Any Qualified Provider' model, meaning there are multiple options for patients as to where they receive their care. Across the Tees Valley there are six providers:

- County Durham and Darlington NHS Foundation Trust (CDDFT)
- Minor Ops North Tees and Hartlepool NHS Foundation Trust (NTHFT) Outside Clinic (domiciliary care only) Scrivens

In order to ensure that these services meet the needs of local people. NHS Tees Valley CCOs capturing the views and superiences of patients againful their retirent making an appointment, treatment and follow-up care. NHS Tees Valley CCG is currently reviewing non-complex, age-related adult hearing services across the Tees Valley. They offer comprehensive support following a referral from their GP, such as a Hearing Needs Assessment, fitting of hearing aids, follow-up assessments and more.
