What people think in Dyke House

When we spoke to people in Dyke House at the end of last year, people in the community told us what they thought was important in the area We'll use this information, as well as your thoughts and ideas, to plan how we can support and implement your ideas in the coming year.

The main issues people talked about were:



The environment

Responses said that the local environment was important. This includes issues like litter, pests, tidy gardens and park areas.

Crime and anti-social behaviour

Responses mentioned anti-social behaviour. This included crime, drugs and alcohol, noise, gangs, nuisance driving and motorbikes.

Activities for children

Responses said there weren't enough activities for children in the area.

Community issues

Responses said that issues such as parking, police numbers, private landlords, the park and safety at night.

To make real change in your community, people need to work together. So as well as our Big Clean Up, we're launching a locality plan and community forum, as well as linking in with the existing organisations working in the area.
