## How to find information about allocations for September 2025

The following information is based on the initial allocation on 16 April 2025 of applications received by the deadline of 15 January 2025. The oversubscription criteria published in this document are **summaries** of schools' published oversubscription criteria. Please read the ['Admission into Primary School September 2025' Application Guide](#) and the individual policies on each school website for more detailed information.

The schools are listed in alphabetical order and are grouped in geographical areas so you can compare the schools closest to your residence. If you are unsure which schools are closest to you, you can check your nearest schools using the Department for Education's [checking tool](#).

### Key definitions

There are several types of school that service primary-aged pupils in the Royal Borough of Windsor and Maidenhead (RBWM).

#### Academies

An academy is an all-ability school that is run by an academy trust and its governors independently of the local authority and is funded entirely by central government. The governors are responsible for setting the admissions policy.

#### Voluntary aided schools

Voluntary aided church schools are supported by the Church Diocesan Boards and the local authority. The governors are responsible for setting the admissions policy.

#### Free schools

A free school is an all-ability school which is run by the governing body independently of the local authority and is funded directly by the central government. They are set up to meet the needs of the local community. The governors are responsible for setting the admissions policy.

Although these schools are their own admitting authorities, some of them buy back into the local authority's validation service, which means that the local authority grade/rank their applications on their behalf for a fee. The local authority is also responsible for maintaining these schools' waiting lists up until 31 August.

### Community and voluntary controlled schools

Community and voluntary controlled schools are maintained by the local authority. The local authority is also responsible for setting the admissions policy.

The council strives to ensure fair allocations of school places according to criteria that have been set in advance. Where a school receives more applications than there are places, the following are the criteria that will be applied to determine which children should be offered places.

You will see both the summary statistics and the oversubscription criteria for these schools in this document. As mentioned above, the oversubscription criteria published here are **summaries** of schools' published oversubscription criteria.
