

Diagnostic pathway for children 0-5 years - Autistic Spectrum Disorder (ASD)

You can talk to anyone in Universal Services about your child, including GPs, health visitors, schools, nurses, speech and language therapy, children's centres

Still concerned? You or any professional can contact the Single Point of Access (SPA) on 020 8547 5008 for advice between 8am and 6pm, Monday to Friday. (Out of hours call 020 8770 5000)

A decision on whether an assessment is required will be communicated within 48 hours. Referral will be passed to appropriate services depending on age and needs identified

Child Development Team

Social Communication Clinic

Developmental assessment
Community paediatrician with input from a range of professionals, including speech and language therapy service makes assessment
Covers: developmental history, social interaction, cognitive functioning and co-morbidities

If a **Social Communication Clinic** assessment is identified following paediatric assessment, you will receive information about what will happen and what you can do to support your child in the meantime
You will also receive information about other support services (eg, parent support groups or parenting courses, etc)

- ASD diagnosis confirmed

Multi-professional joint assessment
Involving 2-3 professionals. Includes: ASD specific history, observation, social communication assessment and ADOS (a play-based assessment)

Multi-professional joint assessment for complex cases
Involving 3-4 professionals. Includes: developmental history, observation, and ADOS, with other assessments as needed for children with one or more additional presenting needs

If decision is 'Not ASD' feedback and advice is provided to parents or carers regarding other universal services or support. Second opinion may be requested by the parents or carers

Feedback offered and support plan agreed with parents or carers
Report and recommendations for a range of options, including details of the local user group, parenting group and options on medications
