# Children and Young Peoples Specialist Nursing Team

## The service we provide

The Children and Young People's Continuing Care Team offer support in the form of respite care and / or continuing care packages to children and young people with complex disabilities and health needs.

Special School Nurses provide care and support to children in Special schools.

Specialist Nurse for Children with Additional Health Needs works with children in a variety of settings as well as providing training to care givers.

Staff working as part of the Specialist Nursing Team have the expertise to take on the lead professional (key worker) role.



## The Team



The team is made up of experienced children's nurses, learning disabilities nurses and health care assistants.

- Complex Care Nurses work with children 0-19 years with continuing care or complex needs.
- Special Schools Nurses work with children 2-19 years in the Borough's four Special Schools and Two Nurseries.
- Additional Health Needs Nurse works with children 0-19 in mainstream settings.

Health care assistants (HCA), who are trained on the National Apprenticeship or Nurse Associate training schemes, deliver much of the direct care. They work both in the child / young persons home and in a community setting — for example schools and the voluntary sector.
