This document is a resource for schools describing SEMH interventions and services available in the local area. It was developed by a working group of representatives from the Barnet community from the Leading Edge Group (LEG) for SEMH, including parent/carers; SENCo representatives from Barnet primary, secondary and special schools; advisory teacher from high incidence support team (HIST); educational psychologist (EP) and wellbeing practitioner.

Inclusion criteria for the interventions and services listed include:

- Researched and evidence-based for children and young people aged 2-25 years old
- Recommended by local school staff and school-based practitioners
- Available locally

The document does not promote or advocate organisations and interventions but offers a range of interventions and services that may meet specific SEMH needs.
