
The Children and Families Act 2014 and the SEND Code of Practice 2015

- A different approach to supporting children and young people with SEND and disabilities
- A focus on outcomes rather than inputs
- A focus on children and young people's strengths and abilities and what is important to them
- An expectation that universal services will be inclusive and that targeted and specialist services are in addition to rather than instead of
