Fair Rules for your Terrific Toddler

Safety

When your Terrific Toddler is playing on their own, cover or remove potential dangers in the room. These include open sockets, trailing wires, or cables, sharp edged furniture, glass or ornaments.

Be Consistent

Try to be consistent and strike a balance: too strict and they Might become inhibited, uncooperative, or scared to show initiative; too laid back and they may get out of control.

Be Reasonable

Don't put sweets on a table near a three-year old and then expect them not to want to eat them.

Mean it!

Avoid unrealistic, sweeping statements i.e. 'You'll never have another sweet if your naughty' or If you say "only one more sweet" then that should mean only one more sweet!







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• Give clear, simple instructions 'You can have a banana when you have finished all your lunch'.



Don't nag; they'll stop listening
'I've told you again and again, no more sweets if you carry on.'



Be understanding and loving

If you've told your child no sweets and he eats one you mistakenly left lying around, let them know that you realise it must have been too hard to resist and give him a hug. He'll learn a lot if you admit you made a mistake.



- Respect their point of view and involve them in decisions 'What do you think about sweets on Saturdays, and none the rest of the week?'
- Punishments should be immediate and in proportion, then forgotten. Show them they're still loved.
 Although it's temping to shout or smack, don't! This only makes it worse and sets the wrong example.
