Berkshire Sensory Consortium

The Berkshire Sensory Consortium Service works with children and young people up to the age of 19 attending school and resident in the Berkshire Unitary Authorities who have educational needs arising from a diagnosed hearing, visual or multi-sensory impairment. Specialist teachers, paediatric habilitation specialists, educational audiologists and specialist teaching assistants provide a key worker service for pre-school children, pre-school groups, parent workshops and provide advice, teaching and training for pupils, parents and schools.

The Berkshire Sensory Consortium loans specialist equipment to schools for children resident and attending schools in the Berkshire local authorities who are on our caseload and whose needs are not met via the education, health and care plans or high needs funding from their resident local authority.

Boyn Grove Day Care Services

This service is provided by Optalis on behalf of the Royal Borough of Windsor and Maidenhead (RBWM).

Boyn Grove is a learning disability community resource centre for adults in Maidenhead. It is for adults with learning disabilities, who may also have additional complex physical disabilities and sensory needs, living within the Royal Borough of Windsor and Maidenhead.

Service users range in age from 19 to over 65. Some live at home with parents or relatives, others in group homes or live independently in the community.

Provide parents and carers with a break from caring. Offer a safe, supportive and friendly environment for people with a learning disability to maintain and develop skills.

To promote choice, independence and involvement. To support people with a learning disability to maintain and develop friendships and social networks. To offer personalised support for individuals.

Children, Young People and Families (CYPF)

CYPF works as part of Berkshire Healthcare Foundation Trust and provides care and support to children, young people and their families across Berkshire. In RBWM, we provide a range of services including, Child and Adolescent Mental Health (CAMHS), Children and Young People's Integrated Therapies (CYPIT) which includes occupational therapy, physiotherapy and speech and language therapy, neurodevelopment AAT and ADHD service, Immunisation Service, Specialist Children's Service (SCS) which includes paediatricians, specialist community nursing, respite, and some dietetics, looked after children (LAC) and the Berkshire Eating Disorder Service (BEDS).

CYPF works in close partnership with children, young people and their families and all key partners providing integrated care where this makes sense to do so, placing children and young people at the centre of everything they do.

Community Team for people with learning disabilities (CTPLD)

The Community Team for People with Learning Disabilities (CTPLD) help, advise and support people with a learning disability aged 18+ and their carers who live in RBWM.

The team is made up of employees from Health and Optalis Adult Social Care Services (in partnership with the borough) and includes: social workers, assessment officers, community nurses, behavioural nurses, occupational therapists, physiotherapists, psychologists and speech and language therapists.

Early Years SEND Team

The Early Years Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) Inclusion Service supports the successful inclusion of children with special educational needs in early years settings or childminder provision who are in receipt of educational funding for 3 and 4 year olds. We advise educational staff on how to help children with additional needs to access to the Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum to ensure that they receive the best possible start to their education.

Support can be offered to early years settings at a general level for example, developing policies and practices to support inclusion or to offer advice about an individual child or group of children who have additional learning, physical, emotional or social needs.

Family Action

Family Action provides the young carers service on behalf of RBWM to reduce the burden of care on children and young people aged 5 to 18 years. We provide young carer assessments and young adult carer transition assessments to create a bespoke support plan, dependent on needs identified. Young carer practitioners work actively with families for four to six months to reduce inappropriate caring roles and ensure caring is at a safe and healthy level, using interventions such as family sessions, one-to-one targeted support, group work, respite breaks during the school holidays and referrals and signposting.

In addition to family support, our service provides professionals training on the identification and support of young carers, and facilitates external services across education, early help, statutory services and healthcare to achieve the National Young Carers Award scheme.

Family Friends

Family Resilience Service (FRS)

Available to families with children under 18 years (or up to the age of 25, if they have special educational needs or disability).

FRS assists parents, carers and children when they are experiencing a number of challenges within their family life. The team provides whole family support to build upon the family's existing strengths. This helps families to overcome difficulties, improve their circumstances and leads them to achieve their 'family goals'.

What we do: Our aim is to improve families' lives by:

- reducing difficulties such as crime and anti-social behaviour
- increasing school attendance
- supporting families that need help with day to day routines and parenting
- protecting families from domestic abuse
- supporting adults back into work
- helping children, young people and their parents to access appropriate support from other services when needed

Inclusion Charter

Information, Advice and Support (IAS) Service for Windsor and Maidenhead

The IAS Service provides free, impartial and confidential information, advice and support to children and young people with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) up to age 25, and their parents or carers. A child or young person does not need a formal diagnosis, we can help if you feel there is a special educational need.

We provide:

- a free and confidential service provided at 'arms length' from education, health and care providers
- impartial information, advice and support on matters relating to education, heath and social care where there is a special educational need or disability
- advice and support from independently trained Information, Advice and Support Service staff
- support through statutory processes relating to education health care (EHC) needs assessments and planning
- information and practical support to find answers to your questions

We can support you by:

- listening to your views and your concerns
- helping you to feel more confident to express your views
- explaining your options, rights and responsibilities
- helping with forms, letters and reports
- helping prepare for meetings and/or attending meetings with you

- answering your questions about educational health care needs assessments and EHC plans
- supporting you through a needs assessment or annual review
- helping you to resolve disagreements

Life Skills Project

The Youth Service works with the Children and Young People Disability Service to provide the Life Skills Project for 16 to 22 year olds with special educational needs and disabilities. The programme aims to:

- support young people's transition into adulthood by developing a range of basic life skills (cooking and nutrition, financial planning, travel training, CV writing, interview training) as well as looking at housing options and entry into employment and training
- promote young people's personal development (raising self-esteem and confidence, building trust, overcoming fears, positive thinking and achieving goals)
- provide information for young people on positive behaviour, for example, drug and alcohol awareness and internet safety
- provide social opportunities and the chance to meet new people. there is also time in each session for youth club activities such as pool, table tennis, Wii and arts and crafts
