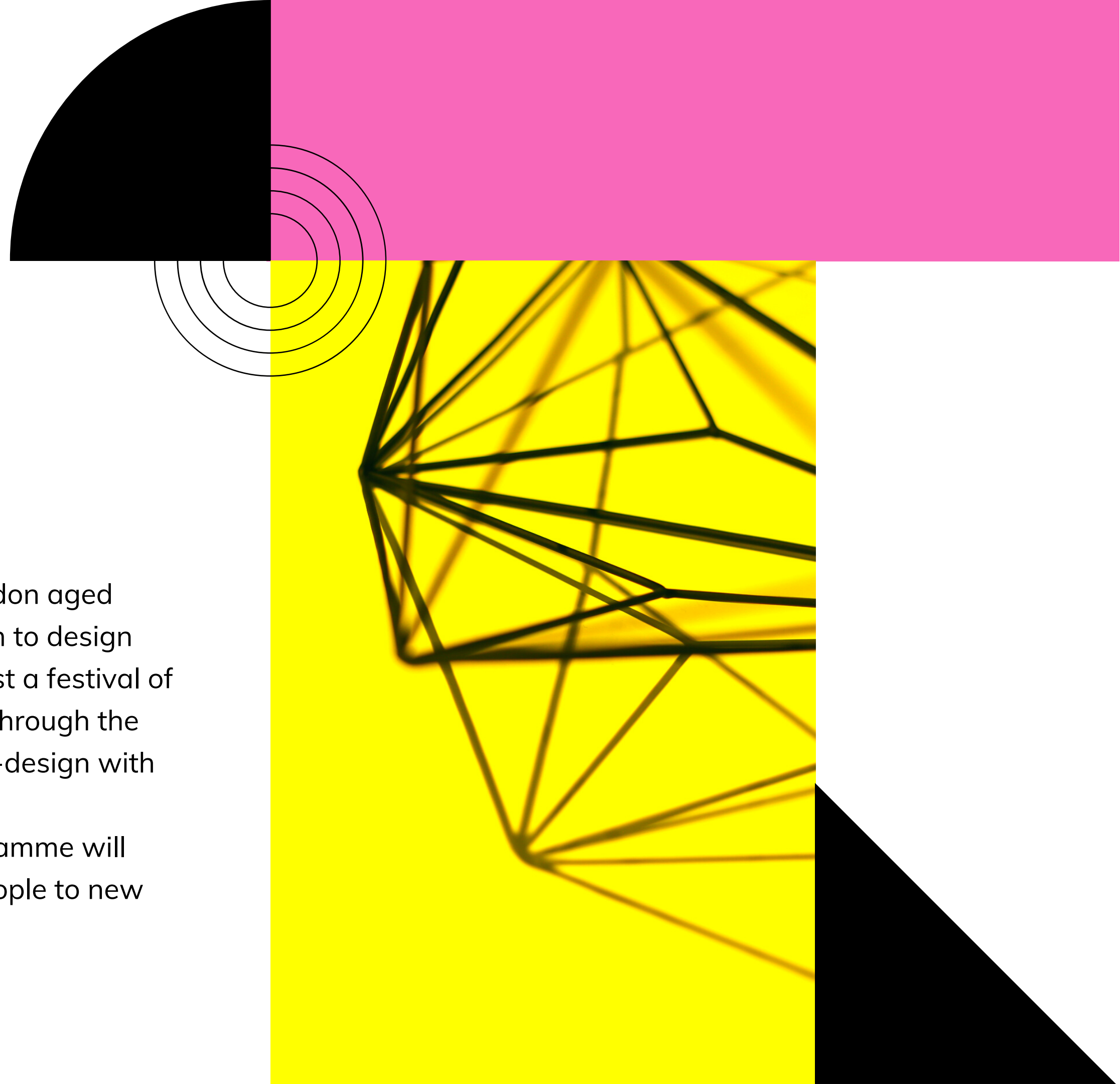

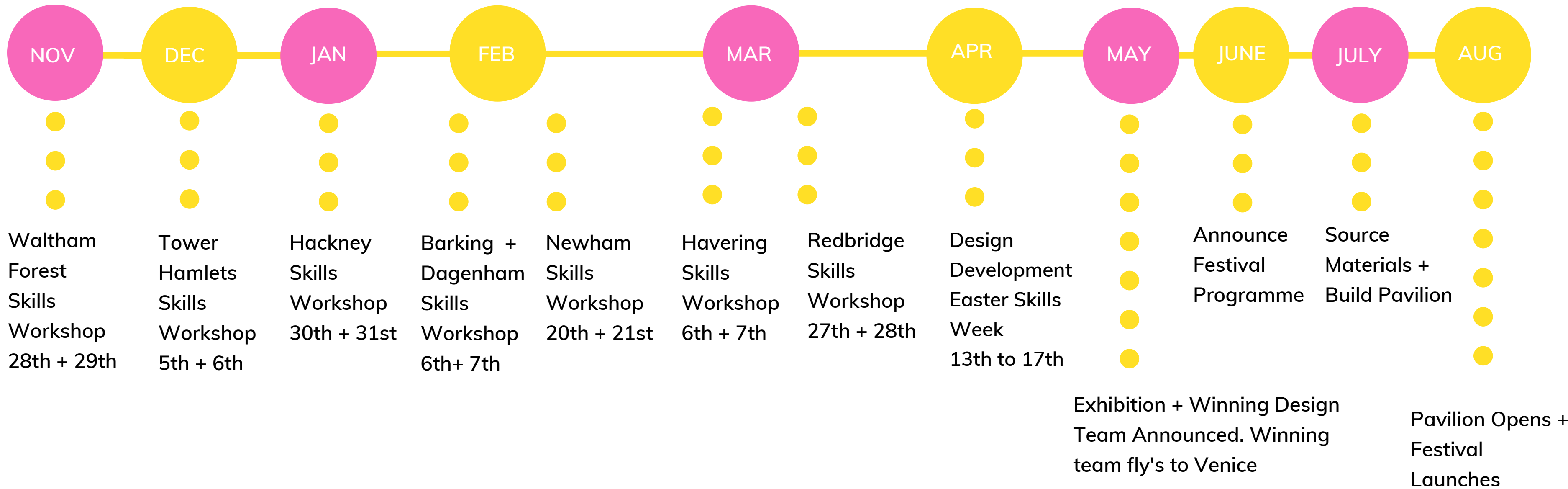
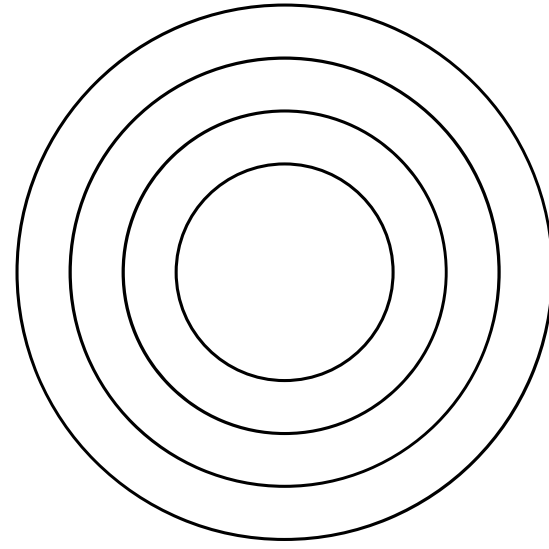

The People's Pavilion offers young people in East London aged between 14-19, the opportunity to enter a competition to design and build a temporary structure (Pavilion) that will host a festival of cultural activities programmed by young Londoners. Through the design competition we will test a new approach to co-design with young people, engaging them in placemaking and the programming of arts and cultural activities. The programme will develop skills, build networks and introduce young people to new careers in the design, build and creative sector.

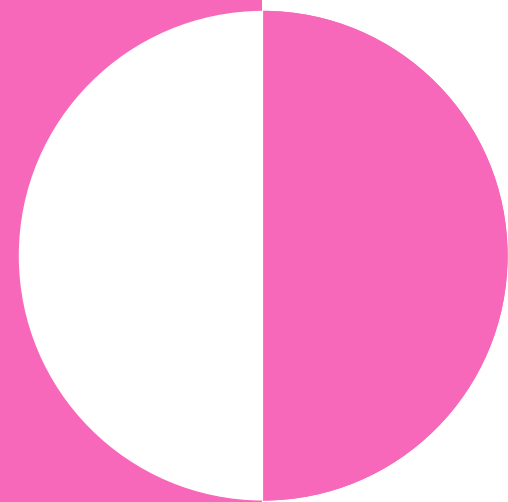
Creative Programming

CONTENT PRODUCERS

We want to maximise opportunities for young East Londoners to have seat and voice at the decision-making table when it comes to the built environment and the activities that take place in those environments. We want to give young people agency, whilst building their skills in curating cultural programmes for their peers.

Young people will lead on the conversations and events that are important to them, whether that be music, art, business, climate change or knife crime, it will be an opportunity to invite policy makers to hear directly from the youth community about what services they wish to see in the City, delivered in an engaging and creative way, working with curators at the V&A Museum and many other cultural institutions.

The Saturday will be our architecture and engineer team exploring concept design.

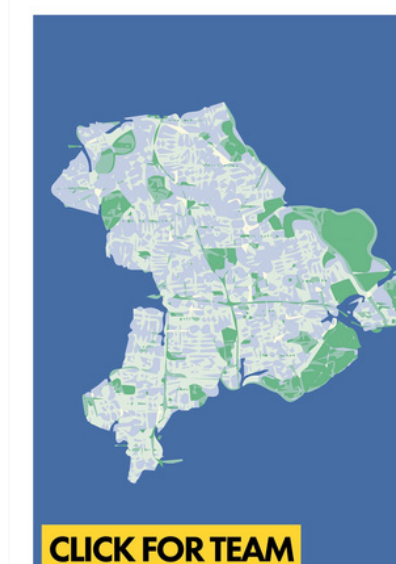

Criteria

Location

The programme is being launched in East London in collaboration with Here East. Young people living in any of the following London boroughs can enter the design competition: Newham, Tower Hamlets, Hackney, Walthamstow Forest, Barking and Dagenham, Redbridge and Havering.

Age

The competition and programme curation team is open to those aged 14-19 years of age (at project launch in September 2020).

Teams

Individuals alone can not enter the design competition, you have to be in a team of at least 2 and no more than 3. We can pair young people to a team when you arrive if you don't have one.



Shortlist Designs

One design team from each East London Borough

We will shortlist design teams from each of the East London Boroughs, at the end of the skills workshops, one from Newham, Tower Hamlets, Hackney, Waltham Forest, Barking and Dagenham, Redbridge and Havering.

The judging panel will consist of leading industry professionals and young and emerging creatives in London. They will follow our scoring criteria which will be made clear in the competition design brief.

We will announce the shortlisted teams through a newsletters, social media announcements and local press.

Design Development

EASTER SKILLS WORK

Skills Workshops

Design teams will be shortlisted and invited to develop their designs further during the second week of the Easter Holiday, working with some industry heavyweights in the field of design.

They will collaborate with our professional design team of architects, engineers and creatives who will help support them in developing their designs, visiting design studios and accessing industry workshops.

Skills Workshops

The teams will learn how to problem solve, developing critical thinking skills in how to address site specific constraints and in line with planning permissions and regulations, adapting designs accordingly.

They will network with over 30 industry professionals throughout the week.

Exhibition of Designs

CELEBRATION

We will work with the team at the Poor Collective to curate an exhibition to showcase and celebrate all the design contributions submitted by the young people. This is an opportunity to showcase everyone who submitted design ideas and to enable the shortlisted teams to present their final developed designs to an industry panel of creatives, designers and architects. There will be a physical and digital exhibition.

Winners Study Trip Venice Biennale

A winning design and team will be chosen during the exhibition, this design will then be built at Here East in the Olympic Park. Collaborating with this years British Pavilion Curators for the Venice Beinnale, duo Madeleine Kessler and Manijeh Vergheze of Unscene Architecture, we will take the winning design team on a two day study trip to Venice. Here they will experience one of the World's most renowned architecture and design festivals in the world.

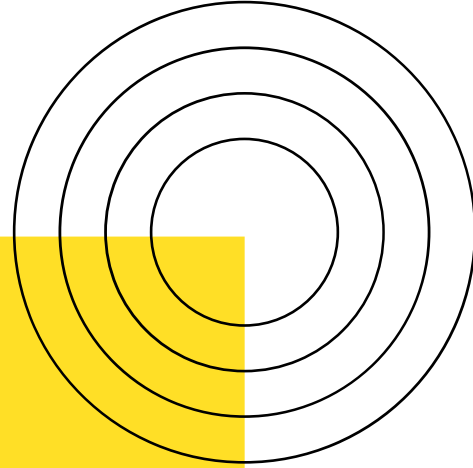
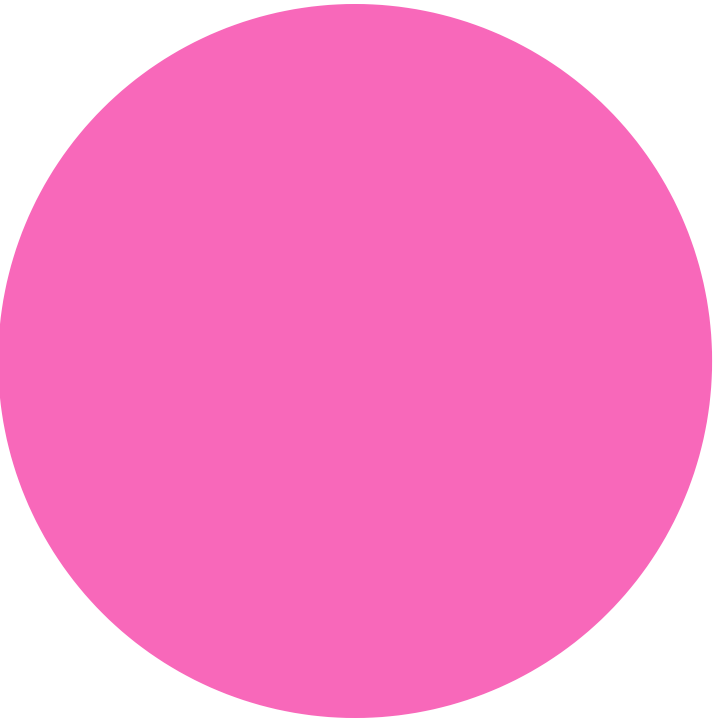
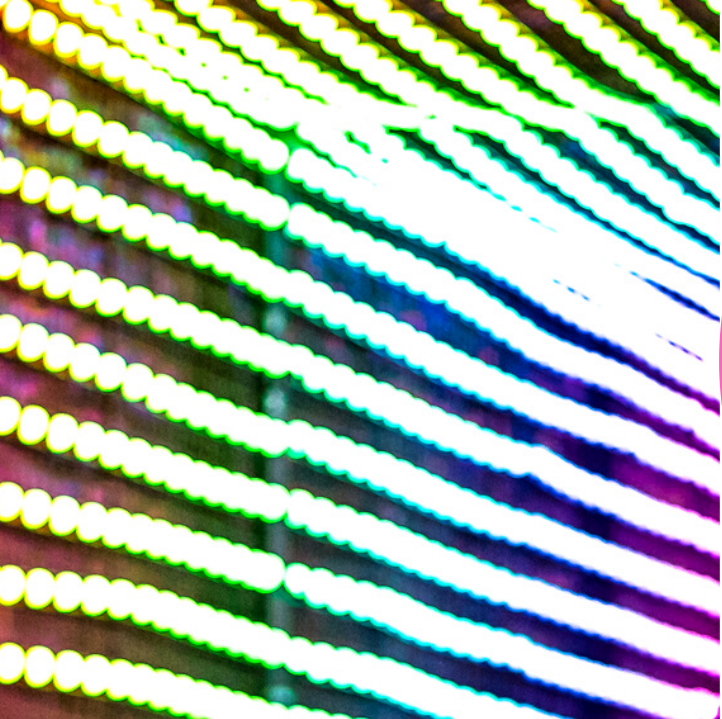
The structural engineer team at Scale Rule CIC will build the Pavilion at the end of July.
