Hartlepool Art Gallery sits centrally within the cultural quarter of the town and is part of the Church Street Innovation and Skills Quarter (ISQ). It is a stunning and beautifully restored Grade 11 Victorian Church, formerly known as Christ Church, which was built in 1858. The Gallery opened in 1996 and is within a minutes' walk from Hartlepool Railway Station, and close to Hartlepool Town Centre, the Middleton Grange Shopping Centre, National Museum of the Royal Navy Hartlepool, and Town Hall Theatre. Church Street and Church Square are the centre of the town's revitalisation, based around the new campus for Cleveland College of Art and Design – The Northern School of Art.

The gallery has two exhibition spaces available, The Main Gallery and The Apse Gallery. It has an extensive exhibition programme, which aims to be ambitious and culturally diverse. The gallery's programming group strive to ensure the exhibition line up appeals to our local audience and is inspiring for future artists. This is achieved through a programme mix of in-house curated exhibitions, open artist proposals, and exhibition's developed in partnership.
